Dear Secretary Phelan,

We write to you with grave concern regarding recent reports that Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth ordered the United States Naval Academy to remove books from circulation in Nimitz Library that advance "gender ideology" or "discriminatory equity ideology" pursuant to the January 29, 2025 Executive Order "*Ending Radical Indoctrination in K-12 Schooling*." It was also reported that 900 books were identified for potential removal¹ and that 400 books are currently being purged from the Nimitz Library.²

If true, this is a blatant attack on the First Amendment and a clear effort to suppress academic freedom and rigor at the United States Naval Academy. Moreover, it displays an alarming return to McCarthyera censorship.

We note that the collection philosophy of the Nimitz Library explicitly affirms that "[i]ntellectual and academic freedom have been cornerstones of academic thought and rigor for over a century in higher education in the United States. The Nimitz Library is dedicated to these core principles of building knowledge in its acquisition, promotion, and retention of scholarly materials. Thus, the librarians actively acquire resources from content creators that encompass the full spectrum of voices and perspectives available."³

This philosophy is in keeping with the recent testimony of Lieutenant General Tony Bauernfeind, Superintendent of the United States Air Force Academy, before the Senate Armed Services' Subcommittee on Personnel, who stated that the military service academies endeavor to teach the future leaders of our diverse armed forces "*how* to think, and *not what* to think." To develop the next generation of Naval officers, the United States Naval Academy must remain committed to intellectual freedom by ensuring the Brigade of Midshipmen can access, explore, and express ideas freely without restriction or interference. Thus, we demand that you immediately cease the review and removal of books and materials at the United States Naval Academy.

- 1. Was the United States Naval Academy directed to initiate a review and removal of books within the Nimitz Library? If so, by whom?
- 2. What books have been identified for potential removal and how were they identified?
- 3. Have books already been removed from circulation in Nimitz Library? If so, what books have been or will be removed?

We appreciate your attention to these questions.
