I want to thank the Chairman for convening this hearing and the witnesses for their time and willingness to appear before the subcommittee.

Since you testified in front of this subcommittee last year, the global security situation remains dynamic. Russia continues its violent assault on Ukraine's sovereignty. China, our "pacing challenge" as defined by the National Security and Defense Strategies, continues its threatening posture toward Taiwan, military assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific region, and global influence campaign.

North Korea continues its persistent testing of ballistic missiles. Iran and its proxies continue their malign activities. And violent extremist organizations continue seeking to attack the United States and our allies.

For the Defense Intelligence Enterprise specifically, we continue to see concerning trends in this strategic competition. Last fall the NSA in coordination with the FBI and CISA released a report highlighting Chinese cyber threats to our critical infrastructure and the security of the Defense Industrial Base. Likewise, just two months ago, the DIA issued a report further exposing ties between Russia and Iran over the use of lethal Iranian drones in Ukraine.

And we are continuing to monitor the growing relationship between Russia and the PRC – especially as the latter reportedly spends billions of dollars in support of Russian disinformation.

These are just a select few instances that reflect the need for increased focus and agility from the Defense Intelligence Enterprise when it comes to strategic competition.
